- Do you understand your puppy will cry/bark when kenneled day or night?
 (Especially the first week or so)
- Do you understand your puppy will poop/pee in your house?
 (Get ready to spot clean)
- Do you understand your puppy has potential to cause damage to your house/yard and objects within?
 - (RIP cell phone chargers)
- Do you understand your daily and nightly routines and lifestyle will change when you bring home your puppy?
 - (It's like a newborn but kennels are acceptable)
- Are you ready to change your lifestyle to accommodate your puppy.
 (Not always easy but so worth it)
- If you have kids do you understand that your puppy will bite and jump on them?
 (Don't be afraid to set boundaries for both kids and puppy) for example (if the kids wanna play rough and be crazy like kids can be no problem just put the puppy in a safe place like a kennel during this time)
- Do you understand your taking home a puppy who is leaving its mother and siblings?
 (Puppy may be scared and a little quiet or not a great eater for a day or 2)
- Do you understand your puppy looks to you for comfort, instruction, food, exercise, and love.
 (You are your puppies everything)
- Do you understand training and shaping a well behaved dog takes years?
 (Be patient, Rome wasn't built in a day)
- Do you fully understand taking home your new puppy will be hard work, challenging, frustrating, messy, rewarding, fun, and most of all full of love?
