Spay & Neuter / Pet-Only Agreement

This dog is being sold **strictly as a companion pet** and is **not** being sold with breeding rights. At Crystal Rose Canines, the health, well-being, and quality of life of our dogs is extremely important to us. For this reason, we place our dogs only in pet homes and do not permit breeding under any circumstances.

The Buyer agrees that this dog **will not be bred**, whether intentionally or accidentally. The Buyer further agrees to have the dog **responsibly spayed or neutered by a licensed veterinarian** within the first year of life, or at a time recommended by the Buyer's veterinarian based on the dog's individual health, size, and development.

Maintaining a dog in an intact state can increase the risk of behavioral challenges that may negatively impact both the dog and the household. These risks include, but are not limited to, the following:

Behavioral Risks Associated with Intact Dogs

- 1 Increased Roaming & Escape Attempts – Intact dogs—especially males—are more likely to roam in search of a mate, increasing the risk of injury or becoming lost.
- 2 Marking & House Soiling – Intact males often develop urine marking behaviors inside and outside the home.
- 3 Aggression & Reactivity – Hormonal influence can contribute to dominance-related behaviors and territorial aggression.
- 4 Frustration-Based Behaviors – May include excessive barking, whining, pacing, destructive behavior, or anxiety.
- 5 Training & Focus Challenges – Hormones can interfere with impulse control and responsiveness to training.
- 6 Escape Risks During Heat Cycles – Intact females may attempt to escape or attract intact males.
- 7 Mounting & Humping Behaviors – Excessive mounting of people, animals, or objects may occur.

- 8 Increased Risk of Dog Fights – Intact dogs are statistically more likely to be involved in conflicts.
- 9 Behavioral Stress During Heat Cycles – Females may experience mood changes, restlessness, or irritability.
- 10 Reduced Quality of Life in Pet Homes – Hormone-driven behaviors can negatively affect a dog’s overall lifestyle.
